Notes:

- The total of 120 hours required for CSU's B.S., Legal Studies degree consists of 60 lower division course hours and 60 upper division course hours (see attached CSU curriculum worksheet).
- Of the 71 total possible hours transferable from Chattahoochee Tech, 48 are currently a part of Chattahoochee Tech's A.A.S. curriculum (see attached Chattahoochee Tech curriculum worksheet). CSU will award credit for the remainder of the courses if a student has completed them successfully at Chattahoochee Tech.
- Of the courses listed on the attached Chattahoochee Tech curriculum, the following classes will NOT be accepted for transfer credit for the B.S. at CSU:
 - Guided Electives
 - COMP 1000-Intro to Computers
 - PARA 2200 - Paralegal Practicum
 - PARA 2210 - Paralegal Internship I
- At least nine credit hours or equivalent of legal specialty courses must be taken through synchronous instruction at Chattahoochee Tech and CSU. Chattahoochee Tech agrees to provide course syllabi or an e-mail from the Paralegal Studies Program Coordinator to verify how many courses were taken at Chattahoochee Tech by a transferring student in this manner; and,
- Transfer students must comply with CSU residency requirements: A minimum of 30 semester credit hours in residence at Clayton State University. At least 21 of the 30 must be upper division hours counted toward program requirements other than free electives.
